


The Importance of Proportionality and Trends Today

- FRCP 2015 Amendments
 - Rule 26(b)(1): Duty to Disclose, General Provisions Governing Discovery; Discovery Scope and Limits; Scope in General
 - Unless otherwise limited by court order, the scope of discovery is as follows: Parties may obtain discovery regarding any nonprivileged matter that is *relevant* to any party's claim or defense and *proportional* to the needs of the case, considering the:
 - Importance of the issues at stake in the action:
 - Amount in controversy
 - Parties' relative access to the relevant information
 - Parties' resources
 - Importance of the discovery in resolving the issues
 - Whether the burden or expense of the proposed discovery outweighs its likely benefit
- The Sedona Principles Principle 6
 - "Responding parties are best situated to evaluate the procedures, methodologies, and technologies appropriate for preserving and producing their own ESI."

Case Study: Raine Group vs. Reign Capital (S.D.N.Y., Feb. 22, 2022)

- Rules 26 and 34 require parties to conduct a reasonable search for materials relevant to the claims and defenses.
- Court applies proportionality analysis at the preservation and collection phase.
- Parties can determine the contours of a reasonable search by eliminating custodians or locations with redundant information, eliminating inaccessible sources, culling information by date, etc.
- Inadequate, overly broad search term requests are typically not sufficiently targeted to find relevant documents.




Two Questions Arose Regarding Proportionality and Implementing a Defensible eDiscovery Process...

- "How do we index data in-place to perform a targeted search based on proportionality?"



Traditional vs. Modern eDiscovery Workflow




Challenges with the Traditional Process

- Physical access (remote workers)
- Lack of pre-collection analysis results in over- or under-collection
 - Under-collection results in repeating costly and inefficient processing
- Image extraction and processing is expensive and time consuming
- Multiple hand-offs increase costs, risks, and time delays
- Hosting of bulk collected data set can significantly increase cost and data remediation issues



Traditional Method



The Modern Collection Workflow





Technology Best Practices to Operationalize Your eDiscovery Process

- True Early Case Assessment with visibility into potentially relevant data before collection
- Index and analyze TBs of data in-place
- Defensible and secure collection with reporting
- Integration with review platform of choice

Case Studies

Case Study: Healthcare


The Challenge:

A significant amount (over 400) of corporate employees connect into the corporate network on a daily/monthly basis. The ability to collect data from these remote employees was taking weeks or months and, in some cases, could not be performed at all. This created a risk of noncompliance with legal discovery process.

The Solution:

Remote certificate-based authentication allows in-place data discovery and targeted collections.

- Perform remote collections whenever a machine is connected to the internet.
- The majority of collections complete in less than a few hours.



Result:

Enabling compliance with the legal discovery process and a streamlined workflow for the legal technology team.

Case Study: Consumer Product Manufacturer

The Challenge:

10 TB of Network File Share data stored in North and South America in 10 separate file servers.

- Cost to export and process data for legal compliance was prohibitive.
- Inability to search content or identify relevant information put the company at significant legal risk.
- GC and AGC specified that there was not another solution on the market that could address this case.

The X1 Solution:

In-place index of 10 TB of data and allows the legal teams to search and extract content in **hours not days**.



Result:

Improving legal compliance and data collection performance.
